IT'S TIME TO CELEBRATE!

Miriam the prophetess took a hand drum, and all the women followed her with drums and dancing. Miriam sang to them, "Sing to the LORD, for he is highly exalted. The horse and its rider he has thrown into the sea" (Exodus 15:20-21).

The trees of the forest will sing for joy before the LORD, for he is coming to judge the earth. Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever. Say, "Save us, O God of our salvation...to give thanks to your holy name, to glorify you by praising you" (1 Chronicles 16:33-35).
