How It Works

Please keep the following in mind as you prayerfully peruse this list of opportunities:

- Wish List giving must be over and above regular and faithful BOLD STEPS support. The building itself is the #1 priority item.
- You may contribute the full cost of a selected project or a portion of the total cost.
- Listed costs are as accurate as possible but are sometimes good-faith estimates. Should there be a significant difference between a “full cost” gift and the actual cost, the Finance Committee will contact you to discuss your wishes. It would not be our intention to *refund* excess donations, but to *redirect* them to another project.
- This is an appeal for *funding*. Please do not bring a purchased object as your offering without first discussing it with the Finance Committee Chair (Jean Brandt 920-609-7651). If you do have a specific item that you wish to gift, please remember that, as in all areas of stewardship, God deserves nothing less than our very best, not leftovers or discarded items
- Not all items are of equal importance.
 - Priority 1 = **needed** before occupancy (July 15)
 - Priority 2 = **preferable to have** before occupancy (July 15)
 - Priority 3 = **useful**, but can afford to wait until laterThis booklet informs you of Priority 3 items, but we will not receive funds for these until priority 1 and 2 items have been sufficiently funded.
- It is a long-standing practice to not attach names to funded projects. Our free-will gifts are from the heart to God in appreciation for his far greater generosity toward us. A master list of donor names will be recorded and archived.
- As donations are received, we anticipate that numbers will change rapidly, and this printed booklet will soon be out-of-date. We will regularly provide electronic updates by various means. You may always contact a member of the Finance Committee to inquire about the current status of projects.
- The horizontal thermometer below each project indicates progress toward the goal.
- Projects that are fully funded are headlined in green. **Green is good.**

BB. SHELVING FOR CLASSROOM LIBRARIES **Priority #3**

If you would line up in a single row all the books in our school’s classroom libraries, that row would run from one end of a football field to the other. Providing quality but affordable shelving to gather these books into a central library has proven to be quite a challenge. Pricing is an estimate.

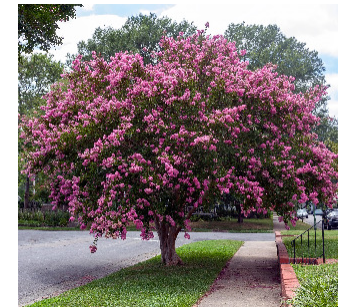
CC. TOPSOIL GRADING **Priority #1**

Driving by the property you will see a mountain of topsoil, scraped from the facility site before construction began. The clay under-soil needs to be brought to proper height, and then the topsoil needs to be spread to support healthy grass. After this is done the rest of the landscaping is up to us.

Goal \$14,900

DD. LANDSCAPING **Priority #2**

Here's a big project for those who love working outdoors. There are shrubs and trees to plant, mulch to spread, and lots of grass to plant and nurture. The listed cost is an estimate for trees, plants, grass seed, mulch, and materials. Initially we want to establish a good degree of curb appeal. There will doubtless be more landscaping later.

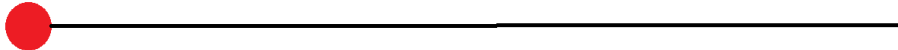
Y. EXTERIOR FLAGPOLE

Priority #3

A sturdy, heavy-duty stainless-steel pole rises 30 feet to patriotically welcome all who approach the building. That this project is "Priority #3" does not suggest it's relative importance, but only that not all projects can be accomplished at once.

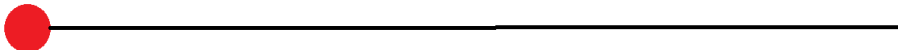

AA. ROLL-UP SHUTTERS FOR KITCHEN SERVING WINDOWS

The kitchen's two serving windows are 8 feet and 10 feet wide. These roll-up shutters will close the kitchen off from surrounding spaces.

Cost \$2,215

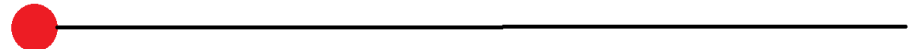
A. PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION SIGN ALONG PLUM ROAD

Priority #3

Initially we'll use current signage while we work on a design for a permanent lighted sign, which will include an electronic display for messaging. The electronic messaging display is the expensive component. The pictured sign is an example, not the final design.

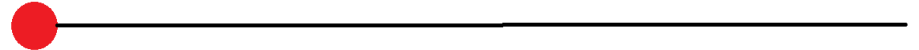


B. DUMPSTER ENCLOSURE

Priority #1

We will need larger commercial dumpsters, which by code must be enclosed. We anticipate an attractive wooden enclosure next to the soon-to-be-built garage.

Goal \$4,800

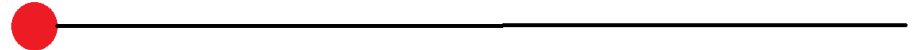


C. CUSHIONING WOOD CHIPS FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD PLAY AREA

Priority #1

Considerable discussion went into the decision to use Engineered Wood Chips created from the Tamarack tree. This material resists both rotting and mold, and is safe, clean, and long-lasting. It will be installed to a depth of approximately 9 inches, as per safety codes.

Goal \$5,150



D. EARLY CHILDHOOD PLAYGROUND APPARATUS Priority #1

The school's Parent Organization has selected the pictured apparatus, which is ADA compliant for our children's safety, and is specifically designed for two to five-year olds.

U. FIBER AND INTERNET TO BUILDING Priority #1

Much inside our new facility will not work without this connection. The noted cost is only 20% of the actual bid on this project, because grants cover the other 80%. This cost may seem high, but the cables had to brought to the building from the nearest connection point, including drilling under Highway 96.

Goal \$8,000

E. ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PLAYGROUND APPARATUS

The pictured activity apparatus will keep many kids well occupied at recess time. This big package was delivered in early April 2023.

Cost \$20,500



V. IT INFRASTRUCTURE Priority #1

This project extends the fiber cabling throughout the building and is also largely covered by grants. The cost noted below is our share.

Goal \$11,800

F. OUTDOOR "GARDEN" BENCHES FOR PLAYGROUND AREAS

One five-foot bench is planned for each of the two playground areas. Yes, sometimes a child will need a "timeout" space, and sometimes teachers will need to take a rest! The composite construction material is weather resistant.

Cost \$730 each



W. WOOD TONGUE-IN-GROOVE CEILING FOR EXTERIOR CANOPY AND MAIN ENTRANCE

Both materials and labor have already been donated for this attractive project.

Cost \$2,500

X. EXTERIOR WOOD LIGHTED CROSS

The cross, affixed to the front of the building, will clearly identify us as followers of Christ, and that God's people worship here. The cross measures 16' x 9' and has 9" wide beams.

Cost \$1,000

Q. GYM SAFETY PADDING

Priority #2

Colored in cardinal red, pads on the walls beneath the baskets and around the side-beams will protect against nasty collisions!

- End wall padding (2 sets needed) Goal \$600 each
- Side wall padding (2 sets needed) Goal \$600 each
- Beam padding (10 sets needed) Goal \$TBD

G. PLAYGROUND MISCELLANEOUS

Priority #2

Various pieces of playground equipment from the present location need to be moved to the new site and re-installed. A sandbox and similar smaller items will be purchased or constructed to “complete” the outdoor play area.

Goal \$3,000

R. A/V SYSTEM FOR WORSHIP SPACE

Priority #1

This quality system will enhance the listening experience of all worshippers. Remember that we are dealing here with the precious Word of God which needs to be clearly heard.

Goal \$12,500

H. THIS ONE'S IN CONCRETE

Priority #1

There are several concrete projects to be installed –

- Basketball “court” Goal \$7,850
- 540 feet of sidewalks Goal \$13,300
- Early childhood trike “racetrack” Goal \$7,850

S. WORSHIP SEATING

These metal-framed cushioned chairs are specifically designed for worship spaces. Each hook to its neighbor to keep rows straight and includes a hymnal rack beneath. When we move into our new church (Construction Phase 2) these will be moved to the new space. Pricing is for 200, the listed capacity of the worship space.



Cost \$11,000

T. OFFICE FURNITURE COLLECTION

We were blessed with a collection of office furniture, used but in very good condition, including desks, a credenza, table, chairs, files, bookcase, and more – about ten pieces in all. In addition, unique needs in some offices may require additional purchases.

Cost \$1,575

I. FENCE ME IN

Priority #1

- Fence and gates around early childhood playground Goal \$5,300
- Fence around HVAC pad Goal \$1,980
- Fence around retention pond Goal \$15,900

J. GARAGE

Priority #2

This 28' x 36' structure will serve multiple purposes

- Storage space for seldom used items (Christmas trees, etc)
- Storage for not-in-use school furniture
- and more

Note that building this amount of storage within the main building would have been considerably more expensive.

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M. GYMNASIUM SCOREBOARDS

Priority #2

The latest in scoreboard software technology combined with a laptop computer and two large LED (TV) screens will give our gym score – reporting flexibility not possible with traditional scoreboards – and at a lower price.

N. MAIN BACKBOARDS

Priority #1

These ceiling-mounted backboards can be drawn to the ceiling when they are in the way of other gym activities. These boards, of course, are made of shatterproof glass.

L. WINDOW TREATMENTS

Our Interior Design Committee plans 2" faux-wood Venetian blinds throughout the building for a clean, uniform look. There are 24 windows in the classrooms, offices, and the worship space.

For gym classes and recess times there will be two of these attached to the wall opposite the bleacher side of the gym. They are height adjustable
